ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION

WHEREFORE, Respondent, **Culta, LLC**, License No. **G-17-00014** (“Respondent”), has successfully complied with the probationary terms and conditions agreed upon in the Consent Order between Respondent and the Maryland Medical Cannabis Commission (the “Commission”) in **Case Nos. 21-00263 & 22-00102**, dated October 17, 2022; and

WHEREFORE, pursuant to Section 7(b) of Ch. 254 (H.B. 556), Acts of 2023 and Ch. 255 (S.B. 516), Acts of 2023, the Maryland Cannabis Administration is the successor of the Maryland Medical Cannabis Commission in matters concerning the regulation of medical cannabis; and

WHEREFORE Respondent has successfully completed the probationary terms and conditions imposed by the aforementioned Consent Order during the period relevant thereto, and has submitted a Petition to Terminate Probation; it is hereby

ORDERED that Respondent’s probation is hereby **TERMINATED** and shall have no further force and effect, although the same may be considered for sanctioning purposes in the event Respondent is found to have committed additional violations related to a cannabis license, and it is further,
